



Call for Proposals

ICAPS'04 Workshop Program **International Conference on Automated Planning and Scheduling**

June 3-7, 2004 Whistler, B.C., Canada

The ICAPS'04 Organizing Committee invites proposals for the Workshop Program of the 2004 International Conference on Automated Planning and Scheduling. ICAPS'04 will be held in Whistler, B.C., Canada; information about the conference can be found at <http://icaps04.icaps-conference.org/>

The workshops are intended to provide a forum for people to discuss issues with a selected focus. To foster interaction, the workshops will be limited to 25-50 invited participants. The day-long workshops will be held concurrently on Friday, June 4. Workshop registration will be free to ICAPS'04 participants.

We solicit proposals in all areas related to AI Planning and Scheduling. Proposers are specifically encouraged to consider workshops focused on new and emerging technical ideas, applications of AI planning and scheduling technologies, and interdisciplinary topics.

Proposal Content

Workshop proposals should include:

- A description of the workshop topic. The workshop should focus on specific issues or themes rather than broad, general topics.
- A brief discussion of why the topic is of interest at this time, and why this topic is not adequately addressed by other meetings or conferences.
- A brief description of the proposed workshop format. Formats should maximize opportunities for discussion and interaction, and should seek to involve all workshop participants. Innovative approaches to fostering interaction are encouraged.
- Names and full contact information for the organizing committee, plus short descriptions of their relevant expertise. Community involvement and a previous track record in workshop organization by the

membership of the organizing committee will be considered during evaluation of the proposal.

- A list of potential attendees.

Workshop Organization

Workshop organizers will be responsible for:

- Producing a Call for Participation (CFP), due October 21, 2003. The CFP will be placed on the ICAPS web site. Workshop organizers will be responsible for additional publicity such as distributing the CFP to relevant newsgroups and electronic mailing lists, and especially to potential audiences outside of the ICAPS community.
- Reviewing submissions and issuing invitations to participate in the workshop. Submissions should be received by February 17, 2004, and notification to authors sent by March 16, 2004.
- Formulating the detailed technical program for the workshop.
- Assembling camera-ready copy for the workshop proceedings by March 30, 2004.

Proposal Submission

Workshop proposals must be received no later than September 16, 2003. Plain text or PDF submissions are preferred. Organizers will be notified, by email, of the acceptance or rejection of their proposals by October 14, 2003.
